The state and any department, agency, board or commission, and any political subdivision are prohibited from limiting the morphine milligram equivalents per day of a schedule II controlled substance that may be prescribed for pain management by a licensed health professional.

H2033: DRUG OVERDOSE; GOOD SAMARITAN; EVIDENCE

A person who, in good faith, seeks medical assistance for someone experiencing a drug-related overdose and a person who experiences a drug-related overdose and who is in need of medical assistance cannot be charged with or prosecuted for the possession or use of a controlled substance or drug paraphernalia if the evidence for the violation was gained as a result of seeking medical assistance.

Each school district and charter school is permitted, instead of required if there are sufficient monies appropriated, to stock two or more juvenile doses and two or more adult doses, instead of two of each, of epinephrine auto-injectors at each school. School districts and charter schools are authorized to accept monetary donations for or apply for grants for the purpose of epinephrine auto-injectors or to participate in third-party programs to obtain epinephrine auto-injectors at fair market, free or reduced prices. The requirement for the Department of Education to include in its budget request monies for epinephrine auto-injectors is deleted.

A "qualified patient" (defined) is permitted to make a written request for medication to end the patient's life. Establishes a process for the request, including a requirement for it to be signed and witnessed by at least two persons who meet specified requirements. Also establishes required procedures for the attending physician and a consulting physician. Requires a 15-day waiting period and provides for effect on construction of wills and contracts. Specifies immunities and civil penalties for violations.

H2103: HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS; RELIGIOUS BELIEFS

No later than 12 months after the effective date of this legislation, a health care entity that does not provide certain health care services based on the entity's religious beliefs is required to adopt a policy that provides a complete list of health care services that the entity will not provide to patients, before treatment is initiated, and the patient or patient's representative must acknowledge receipt of the notice. No later than 18 months after the effective date of this legislation, group health plan providers and health insurers are required to provide enrollees with a list of any health care entity within the provider's or insurer's network that does not provide certain health care services based on religious beliefs.

H2109: TOBACCO POSSESSION; SALE; AGE; SIGNAGE

For the purpose of statute prohibiting furnishing a tobacco product to an underage person, a petty offense, tobacco products may not be furnished to a person who is under 21 years of age, instead of to a minor, and the required mental state of doing so knowingly is eliminated. The definition of "tobacco product" is expanded to include "electronic smoking devices" (defined). The crimes of a retail tobacco vendor selling, furnishing or giving beedies or bidis, of selling tobacco products through a vending machine except in specified circumstances, and of delivering or causing unsolicited tobacco products to be delivered to a residence are all modified to apply to products sold or given to an individual who is under 21 years of age, instead of to a minor. Retail tobacco vendors are prohibited from selling or permitting the sale of tobacco products unless a sign with specified dimensions is posted at the location stating that a person who is under 21 years of age cannot purchase tobacco products. Violations are an unlawful practice and a petty offense.

H2127: CHILDREN'S HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM

If the Director of the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS) determines that the amount of state monies appropriated combined with available federal monies may be insufficient for the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), the Director is required to immediately notify the Governor and the Legislature. After consulting with the Governor, the AHCCCS Administration is required to stop processing new applications for CHIP until verifying that funding is sufficient. If the federal government eliminates funding for CHIP, the AHCCCS Administration is required to immediately stop processing new applications and provide at least 30 days' notice to AHCCCS contractors and members that CHIP will terminate. Previously, the AHCCCS Administration was required to immediately notify the Governor and the Legislature and stop processing new applications for CHIP if the state's federal medical assistance percentage for CHIP was less than 100 percent.

H2149: PHARMACIES; REMOTE DISPENSING

For the purpose of pharmacy licensure and regulations, the definition of "pharmacy" is expanded to include a "remote dispensing site pharmacy" (defined) where a pharmacy technician or pharmacy intern prepares, compounds or dispenses prescription medications under "remote supervision by a pharmacist" (defined as a pharmacist directing and controlling their actions through the use of audio and visual technology). A remote dispensing site pharmacy is required to obtain and maintain a pharmacy license issued by the Board of Pharmacy. Additional licensing requirements for remote dispensing site pharmacies are established, including requirements for continuous video surveillance, and recordkeeping and inventory requirements. Establishes minimum experience and professional education requirements a pharmacy technician must have before preparing, compounding or dispensing prescription medications at a remote dispensing site pharmacy.

Establishes a maximum fee schedule for searching, retrieving and providing reproductions of medical records and payment records to third parties. The fee amounts are unspecified (blank in original) and are based on the number of pages reproduced. Also establishes unspecified (blank in original) maximums for the total fees for various forms of records such as an internet portal, compact disc, or digital versatile disc. Does not apply to a request by a third party for the reproduction of medical records and payment records that are necessary for a social security disability application or an appeal from a denial of benefits. Beginning January 1, 2020 and each year thereafter, the maximum fees must be adjusted based on the most recent changes to the consumer price index published by the U.S. Department of Labor. Effective January 1, 2019.

The requirement for the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS) to apply to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services for a waiver to allow Arizona to implement a work requirement, establish a lifetime limit on AHCCCS coverage of five years of benefits, and impose cost-sharing requirements does not include or apply to American Indians or Alaska natives who are eligible for AHCCCS services through the Indian Health Service or through a Tribal or Urban Indian Health Program.
